



## HOW TO APPLY

Submit your completed application and \$750 deposit by December 7. Late applications are accepted; however, additional fees may apply. Your initial deposit will be fully refundable only if you are not selected for the program or if the program is canceled by Baylor University. As participation is limited and requires group booking, cancellation on your part will result in forfeiture of your deposit. Subsequent payments are due as follows: February 24, \$2000; the remainder is due by April 13. Cancellation after April 13 will result in forfeiture of the deposit and 50% of the remaining program fees. Summer tuition and administrative fees (usually due around May 20) must be paid to Baylor before enrollment is considered complete. Students not currently enrolled at Baylor University should contact the program director regarding application and admission policies.

Financial aid awards may be applied to Baylor in Austria, and you may also apply for a Goodrich International Scholarship through the Center for Global Engagement. For details on this and other scholarship possibilities, go to:

## COSTS AND LOGISTICS

**Travel to and from Austria:** At least one program representative will fly from DFW; students may travel with the representative as part of a group flight or may choose to make their own airline arrangements. All participants must meet in Vienna on July 6 at the designated hotel. A valid passport is needed for travel to Austria, and it is the responsibility of each participant to apply for and obtain his/her passport prior to departure.

**Accommodations and Transportation:** Students may opt to stay in a dormitory or with a host family. Public transportation simplifies exploration in Salzburg, and many famous local destinations are easily accessible by foot.

**Estimated Costs:** A program fee of \$4550 includes lodging, most meals, airport and city-to-city ground transportation, excursions, concerts, required insurance, and a cell phone package. BU tuition/fees (\$1237/credit hour), textbooks, airfare to/from Europe, Salzburg bus passes, a limited number of meals, and a small laundry fee are not included. Please note that costs are tentative and may fluctuate due to the number of students and currency valuation. \$750 spending money is recommended.

**Responsibility:** Baylor University will carry out services rendered by the Division of Admissions and Records. Student advisement and enrollment are provided for participants on a continuing basis. Applicants must agree to and sign a statement to abide by all regulations governing students of Baylor University concerning classes, related activities, housing, personal conduct, and travel to, in, and from Austria. This will also include a waiver of liability regarding Baylor University and the program directors. Baylor reserves the right to modify or change any portion of the program should it be necessary. No refunds will be made on or after July 5 to participants who do not follow through with the program in its entirety or who have been dismissed because they have not complied with the program's regulations.

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

### **PROGRAM MISSION**

Students will earn Baylor University credit in music and history while becoming immersed in the culture and community of beautiful Salzburg, Austria and other cities in the region.

### **INSTRUCTION**

All courses are taught by Baylor faculty members (Dr. David Hendon, History; Dr. Jana Millar, Music/BIA Associate Director; and Dr. Terry Lynn Hudson, Music/BIA Director). Students are expected to take at least six credit hours, up to a maximum of eight; any exceptions to this policy must be approved by the program director. German language skills are not required.

Baylor in Austria is delighted to partner with Salzburg College for classes, excursions, and special events.
